## DEFENDANT PLEADS GUILTY IN THREE-DAY ROBBERY SPREE

James Holland, a 41-year-old man, pled guilty on Tuesday to two counts of Aggravated Robbery, felonies of the first degree, and one count each of Robbery, a felony of the third degree, and Failure to Comply, a felony of the third degree. Judge Neal Bronson ordered a presentence investigation and will consider that report prior to imposing sentence.

The charges stem from robberies occurring at the Sav-a-Lot grocery store Franklin on December 29, 2010, the McDonalds restaurant in Franklin on December 30, 2010, and the Family Dollar store in Lebanon on December 31, 2010. In each case, Holland told employees to give him cash from the register and on two occasions he told the employees he had a gun. On December 31<sup>st</sup>, Holland fled from the police in a getaway car at speeds over 100 miles per hour on State Route 741 and Interstate 75, endangering other traffic and passersby. Holland was later arrested in Clark County.

Holland is scheduled to be sentenced on May 10<sup>th</sup>. He faces a maximum of 30 years in prison for the offenses.
