

# **Man Receives 14 Years in Prison For Shooting**

Cameron Henderson, 21, of Mason, Ohio, pled guilty today to attempted murder, a felony of the 1<sup>st</sup> degree, with an attached 3 year firearm specification; and five counts of felonious assault, felonies of the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and received an indefinite prison sentence of 14 to 17 years from Warren County Common Pleas Court Judge Donald E. Oda, II.

On July 22, 2020, Defendant, Cameron Henderson, along with his 13 year old co-defendant, set up a drug transaction near Cottell Park in Deerfield Township, with the intentions of robbing the supplier. Henderson discharged a firearm upon the public street and into a moving vehicle, that was occupied by six individuals, including two minor children, ages eight years old and ages 8 months old. Before firing his weapon, Henderson approached the vehicle and proceeded to fire multiple times, shooting one of the vehicle's occupants in the back of the head. The entire transaction was captured on a Nest video camera.

Warren County Prosecutor David Fornshell commended Detective Brandi Carter of the Warren County Sheriff's Office, Assistant Prosecutors Julie Kraft and Steven Knippen, Victim Witness Director Erika Bouelle, and Legal Assistant Jaclyn Zaczek for their work on the case.
